Baptismal Service

Jesus instructed his followers to make disciples of all nations and then to baptise them into the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. Ideally, baptism should take place soon after you have come to faith in Christ. However, in our society it is not uncommon for people to go many years without being baptised.

Baptism is a public identification with Jesus, and bears witness to us turning from our old life of sin, to new life in Christ. It is for those who have received forgiveness and have been born again of the Spirit.

If you have never been baptised as a believer (in contrast to infant baptism), we invite you to take that step on August 21st.
